Bobobox and Li Ka Shing Foundation in Collaboration with IDI Jawa Barat Donates 100 Sleeping Pods for COVID-19 Hospitals in Jakarta & West Java

**Bandung, 10 April 2020** — Bandung-based accommodation startup company, Bobobox, donates 100 sleeping pods for hospitals mandated to handle COVID-19 cases in Jakarta and West Java. The pods are intended for medical workers to take rest in between their long shifts.

The outbreak of COVID-19 around the world, including Indonesia, has impacted many aspects of life. Doctors and nurses currently stand in the front line of defense against these outbreaks, and the fight has begun to take a toll on those who are most needed to combat it.



With new cases emerging every day, things might get worse before it gets better and this would put our healthcare system under significant stress.

During this hectic time, there have been multiple cases where medical workers directly involved with COVID-19 patients were not allowed to return to their residences due to the fear of virus transmission. Moreover, by April 1st 2020, 84 medical workers in Indonesia were infected by COVID-19 as reported by Tempo.co. Eventually, many of these medical workers have to accept the inevitable fact that they have to take a rest at the hospital with bare-minimum facilities. The lack of quality rest could lower their immune system and increase the risk of being infected.

Therefore, as a token of gratitude and support for our medical workers, Bobobox and Li Ka Shing Foundation in collaboration with IDI Jawa Barat are donating 100 sleeping pods to various COVID-19 hospitals throughout Jakarta and West Java.

"We believe that healthcare workers deserve a recharging rest because their presence and health are crucial at a time like this," said Indra Gunawan, CEO and founder of PT Bobobox Mitra Indonesia. "We hope that our sleeping pods can provide a solution for a better, safer and more convenient place for medical workers to rest, so they can provide care for COVID-19 patients without jeopardizing their own health. I hope this can accelerate the recovery of our nation."

Antonius Bong, president and co-founder of PT Bobobox Mitra Indonesia also added, "The doctors and nurses have been making extraordinary sacrifices to care for us. They are the heroes of this pandemic and they don't have the luxury to stay-in at the comfort of their home like most of us. Especially during these difficult times, they tend to work longer hours to cope with the high workload, at the expense of self-care including adequate sleep. I hope that through Bobobox sleeping pods that we install in the hospitals, healthcare workers can conveniently get the rest and sleep that they desperately need to recharge."

Unlike the regular sleeping pods installed in Bobobox hotel branches, shelter pods that will be donated utilizes basic features with only mattresses, pillows, blankets, lamps, air conditioners, and power outlets. By prioritizing comfort, safety, and minimalism, it is hoped that medical staff will be able to rest well in shelter pods and recharge before going back on duty.
